From 1988 to 1997, Mark served with the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Commission beginning as an Assistant Training Coordinator and rising to Division Manager. He was appointed Deputy Director of the New Mexico Department of Public Safety Training & Recruiting Division in July 1997. He supervised the day-to-day operations of the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy, and was responsible for the licensing and State compliance of ten satellite law enforcement academies. From 2004 to 2015, Mark was a Deputy Assistant Director at the Kansas Law Enforcement Training Center, where he was responsible for the Continuing Education program.

He began his involvement with law enforcement in 1971 with the Thurston County Sheriff's Office, Olympia, Washington, as a volunteer.
