

## **Mr. Paul “Mike” Cunningham, Texas System Police Association, Dallas, TX**

Mike began his career with the UT System Police Department at UT Southwestern. From 2005 to the present, he served in various positions within the department, including as a Field Training Officer within the Patrol Division, a Detective in the Criminal Investigations Division and an Instructor within the Training Division.
